Schedule "IR" – Irrigation Service

Character of Service - Alternating current, sixty Hertz, at a standard voltage supplied by REMC. Irrigation service will be provided with two demand charge options: Interruptible ⁽¹⁾ or Non-Interruptible ⁽²⁾.

Availability - Available to irrigation accounts with transformer capacity requirements of 2,500 kVA or less.

Service Type Rate Schedule and Charges:

Rate IR

Single-Phase Service at 120/240 Volts and 50 kVA Capacity or Less

Annual Basic Service Charge

\$ 360.00 per calendar year, prorated at \$ 30.00 per month

Energy Charge ⁽¹⁾

\$ 0.065000 per kWh

Demand Charge Options:

- Interruptible Service: ⁽²⁾
\$ 7.50 per kW billing demand – All Months
- Non-Interruptible Service: ⁽³⁾
\$ 20.00 per kW billing demand – Peak Months
(*January, February, June, July, August, and December,*)
\$ 10.00 per kW billing demand – Off-Peak Months
(*March, April, May, September, October, November*)

Rate IR+

Poly-Phase Service or Other Single-Phase Service

Annual Basic Service Charge

\$ 600.00 per calendar year, prorated at \$ 50.00 per month

Energy Charge ⁽¹⁾

\$ 0.065000 per kWh

Demand Charge Options:

- Interruptible Service: ⁽²⁾
\$ 7.50 per kW billing demand – All Months
- Non-Interruptible Service: ⁽³⁾
\$ 20.00 per kW billing demand – Peak Months
(*January, February, June, July, August, and December,*)
\$ 10.00 per kW billing demand – Off-Peak Months
(*March, April, May, September, October, November*)

kVAR Demand Charge

\$ 1.00 per kVAR billing demand

⁽²⁾ Interruptible Service Demand Charge Option – **REQUIRED** to interrupt service during peak events.

⁽³⁾ Non-Interruptible Service Demand Charge Option – **NOT REQUIRED** to interrupt service during peak events.

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TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF SERVICE

Demand Charges - KW billing demand shall be the maximum average kW demand for any period of fifteen (15) consecutive minutes during the billing period. kVAR billing demand will be determined by trigonometric calculation using the peak 15-minute kW billing demand and the average power factor for the period.

Demand Charge Options Terms and Conditions:

Interruptible Service: ⁽²⁾

- Is **required** to interrupt service on peak event control periods as determined by REMC or its designated agent within the total capacity limitations set forth in the service.
- It is the members' responsibility for the installation, operation, and maintenance of any control equipment necessary to interrupt service.
- REMC or its designated agent will attempt to notify members regarding service interruption periods but cannot guarantee that timely notifications will be received.
- It is the members' responsibility to maintain and keep REMC informed of their contact information for peak event notification.
- It is the members' responsibility for any voice, data, or text-messaging costs incurred.
- The member shall hold Jackson County REMC harmless from any liability for injuries, damages, or costs that might result from failure to receive timely notifications.
- **In the event an irrigation system fails to interrupt for any reason during the peak event request, the service will be assessed the non-interruptible demand charge for the billing month.**

Non-Interruptible Service ⁽³⁾ Is **not required** to interrupt service on normal peak events within the total capacity limitations set forth in the service.

Metering and Billing – Appropriate metering will be installed by REMC. At times, reasonable estimates will be made due to the unavailability of needed billing determinants. kWh usage may be prorated between billing rate periods. A calendar month billing cycle is required.

Annual Basic Service Charge - The Annual Basic Service Charge is based on a service being active for twelve (12) months per year.

- If active service is not maintained for twelve (12) months per year, any unbilled prorated Annual Basic Service Charges will be billed on the final bill after disconnection of service, unless the service is transferred and remains active.
- If a member requests service disconnected and then later reconnected within a twelve-month period, a reconnect fee must be paid. In addition, the member must pay the amount equal to any unbilled prorated Annual Basic Service Charges for the months the service was disconnected.
- Annual Basic Service Charges will be prorated accordingly for a new service starting during the calendar year.
- The minimum monthly charge shall be the prorated Annual Basic Service Charge, except for those consumers who have contracted for higher minimums to guarantee line extension investments.

Terms of Delivery – The charges under each rate schedule are based upon the supply of service through a single delivery and metering point, and at a single service voltage. If service is supplied to the same consumer through more than one point of delivery or at different service voltages, the supply of service at each delivery and metering point and at each different service voltage shall be separately metered and billed. Each family residential unit shall be served separately. Service is supplied in accordance with rules prescribed by the Bylaws and the Rules and Regulations of REMC and the Indiana Utility Regulatory Commission.

Limitations on Connected Equipment – REMC may require corrective measures or devices for any motor or other connected load that in the opinion of REMC will cause undue voltage fluctuations to other customers. Operation of any motor in excess of ten (10) horsepower must be approved by REMC and may continue only at the discretion of REMC. If three-phase service is supplied, all motors in excess of ten (10) horsepower shall be connected three-phase.

Consumer Facilities – All equipment and facilities beyond the metering point shall be furnished and maintained by the consumer.

Resale – No resale of power purchased under these schedules is permitted.

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Line Extension Cost – Line extension policies may require payment of extension costs if added facilities are required solely to provide requested service. All necessary equipment will be furnished, owned, and maintained by REMC.

Late Payment Charge – If a bill is not paid within seventeen (17) days after the bill is mailed, it shall become a delinquent bill and a late payment charge may be added in the amount of ten percent (10%) of the first three dollars (\$3.00) and three percent (3%) of the excess of three dollars (\$3.00).
